THE VINE: Long ago Isaiah used the metaphor of the vineyard to express the ingratitude of Israel. He said: *The lord of the vineyard had looked for it to yield grapes, but it yielded wild grapes.* At the same time, he prophesised that things would be vastly different. The vineyard after cultivation and toil would produce a magnificent vine – the vine that was Christ. This vine did not spring up suddenly. It had it roots in the past and only came to complete maturity when the feet of the Messiah trod on the soil of Palestine. There was then a long period of fertilisation of the soil before the actual vine appeared. God's providence was at work bringing together the necessary elements for its growth.

I am the vine, said our Lord as he came out of the supper room on his way to the garden of Gethsemane. The vine growing by the wayside must have looked incredibly beautiful bathed in the light of the paschal moon. Christ had a keen aesthetic sense as is evident from the way he spoke about nature. But always he saw in nature not only its beauty but its symbolism. At a marriage feast in Cana he had changed water into wine showing how he could take hold of a common element and give to it a richer and more precious quality. So, he would take the juice of the vine and transform it into his own blood which would circulate in the veins of those who loved him. In this way men would become branches of the vine and gain strength and excellence from its growth. I am the vine; you are the branches, he said. We are to become part of the vine, joined to its main stem, receiving the energy of its growth so that we can bear good fruit. He is the divine power that gives to us spiritual strength in life. The metaphor of the vine is a love image. Where there is love there is union. The branches embedded in the vine show us how close a union between Christ and ourselves there can be if only we respond to his love.

Parish 2020 – A Call for Renewal On the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, 12th December, 2020, Archbishop Anthony Fisher launched our new Archdiocesan Mission Plan *Go Make Disciples* which, with the assistance of the Sydney Centre for Evangelisation, seeks to inspire and support the renewal of our parishes as places of encounter with the living Christ for the faithful and beyond.

In the weeks and months ahead, we will all join together in prayer, calling on the Holy Spirit, to prepare the hearts of each of us and of all our parishes and Eucharistic communities to receive anew the fire of God's love and the desire to be ever more faithful witnesses of Jesus Christ. A summary of the Mission Plan is available in the porch of the Church.

Imposition of restrictions concerning Churches: From Friday, 12th February, an unlimited number of people can attend Mass, provided that the one person per 2 metre square rule is observed. However, our Church will only hold at least eighty according to this regulation, any overflow would have to be accommodated in the Marion Hall where the Mass can be viewed on the TV monitor. Because of the easing of the restrictions, the Archbishop has lifted the dispensation from our Sunday Mass obligation. *Parishioners are once again obliged to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of obligation when this is reasonably possible.* Those of great age, have health conditions or are otherwise anxious about the risks of Covid19 are free to remain at home and find another way of keeping the Sabbath holy. There is still the requirement of taking names and contact details of attendees. The use of a QR code is recommended for those with iPhones or smart phones. The NSW Services app would need to be install on your phone to access the code. The first time you use the code, it will ask you to provide your name and contact number. It will then send you a code to enter with your details and the app will then be active. It is then used every time you attend Mass, or when and where you visit other venues that have a QR code registration system in place.

The wearing of masks is no longer mandatory, but strongly recommended where social distancing is not possible.

Parishioners who elect to attend Mass during the pandemic should consider the safety of other parishioners by staying away if they are unwell, and if so, getting tested and self-isolating while awaiting the results. It is also advisable that parishioners only attend Mass in their own parish and not move from parish to parish.

Confessions are now available before the 5 pm Vigil Mass (4 pm to 4.45 pm).
