Holy Souls: During the month of November (the month of the Holy Souls), I will be offering all my Masses for your deceased relatives and friends.

GOD OF THE LIVING: An old man who was dying asked his Christian doctor if he knew what happened after death. The doctor through for a moment and during the silence there came a scratching at the door of the room. "That's my dog," said the doctor. "He hears my voice, but he has no idea of what is happening in the room. In the same way we have no idea of what is happening behind the door of death, but we do know that Christ awaits us."



Scripture expresses it this way: Eye has not seen nor ear heard what things God has prepared for those who love him. What we do know is that God has prepared wonderful things. We know that death is not a dead end; it is a door opening out to a splendid existence. Christ has told us: God is not the God of the dead but of the living, for all live him. We share the resurrection of Our Lord. All our hopes are centred on him. Death has been

transformed by him into a way of life. His death overcame all deaths; his resurrection gave hope of resurrection to all. The Sadducees denied all

this. They refused to accept Jesus as their Messiah and therefore would not believe his words. To try and trick him into the denial of the resurrection they posed an absurd argument. Our Lord quickly silenced them to the admiration of those who were listening.

The resurrection is the joy and hope of all Christians. Death for them is not like a broken pillar or a burnt-out torch in a graveyard. It is not all tears and sorrow and frustration. Some saint wrote: "If Christ Jesus be the period, the end and lodging-home at the end of your journey, there is no fear; you go to a friend; you may look death in the face with joy." This was Our Lord's guarantee at the last supper to his friends: *I go to prepare a place for your that where I am you also may be.*"




