26th JULY, 2020 – SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

THE GREATNESS OF THE KINGDOM: Christians have from the beginning given everything for the kingdom of heaven. They have seen in it the treasure and the pearl of great value of which Christ speaks in today's Gospel, and they have been willing to give life itself to gain it. Christ set the example. He came to establish the kingdom. It was so precious that he was willing to suffer terrible torments and die on a cross to gain it for humankind.

The reason then why the treasure and the pearl are so valuable is the price that God has put on them. He so loved the world that he sent his Son into it to redeem it so that all could enter the kingdom. "You were bought, not with corruptible things such as gold and silver, but with the precious blood of the Lamb." This love of God is an immense mystery and it is only by trying to understand something of it that one can grasp the value of what he did. The martyrs understood it to the extent that they were willing to give all for it. St. Thomas More, for example, gave up a wonderful home and family, and his life for it. He said when he was in prison "is not this house (the Tower of London) as near heaven as my own in Chelsea?" He also said, "The field is won". He saw that it was worth giving everything he had for it. We should read carefully and meditate on Christ's words in today's gospel. We should pray for that vision of faith which recognises the splendour of the treasure of God's kingdom. We should also rouse our enthusiasm for it and express our gratitude for what Christ did to make it possible for us to gain it. It is not easily obtained. We must work hard not only to procure it, but also to keep it in our possession and not exchange it for some worthless material prize.

Further Relaxation of restrictions concerning Churches. From the 1st July there is no limit of the number of people who can attend Mass provided the 4 square metre per person rule is adhered to. However, our Church will hold at least forty persons according to this regulation, any overflow would have to be accommodated in the Marion Hall. There is still the requirement of taking names and contact details of attendees.

Since the 7th June, we have returned to the normal Mass timetable i.e. 5 pm (Vigil), 8 am and 10 am. Weekday Masses will remain for the time being at 8 am, Monday to Saturday (9 am on Public Holidays). I invite parishioners who wish to attend the Sunday Mass, preferably to email the office ootleycc@bigpond.net.au, or contact Nicki, the Parish Secretary, on Thursday or Friday, to make a reservation (9580 1864). Please nominate the Mass you wish to attend and the number of persons. Parishioners who attended Mass last Sunday have already made their reservation for subsequent weeks. However, if the demand exceeds the requirements, I would be happy to add another Mass to the Sunday, timetable, perhaps at 9 am. Please note, with the social distancing rule, only a maximum of fifty persons can be accommodated in the Church.

Confessions are now available before the 5 pm Vigil Mass (4 pm to 4.45 pm).
