MARTHA: Our world today is full of very busy people. Life is led at a great speed and intensity especially in big cities. The rat race for survival fills the day. Hence people do not have a great deal of time for long prayers. Family cares and business take up much of their time and energy. Martha, in today’s Gospel, was *distracted with much serving* and earned Our Lord’s rebuke: *Martha, Martha, you are anxious and troubled about many things; one thing is needful.* Our Lord then goes on to compare what she was doing with that of her sister Mary and says: *Mary has chosen the better part, which shall not be taken away from her.* What did Our Lord’s rebuke mean? He was certainly not saying that Martha was doing wrong in preparing a meal for him. As St. Teresa of Avila said, “if Martha had imitated Mary, Our Lord would have gone without his dinner.” Jesus might have been saying that it was not necessary to prepare a great number of dishes, one would be enough.

But there was a deeper significance in his words. He was trying to show Martha that it is wrong to be so taken up with the active expression of her devotion as to make that expression the measure of the devotion itself. In other words, he wanted to show that the true measure of service is not to be found in the work itself, in its success or failure, but in the faith and love that inspires it. The lesson then for the busy Christian is simple. It is to transform the work into an activity of love by offering it as a service of God. This can be done by short prayers, by the offering of one’s day to God and by turning one’s thoughts to him sometimes during the day. A good Christian should be a mixture of Martha and Mary. The work should have its roots in prayer, and it should be as far as possible, good work, since it is being done for God. *Labore et Orare* (to work and to pray)!

CONFIRMATION: The children of the parish who are eligible to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation this year, have completed their classes and preparation to receive the Sacrament at St. Mary's Cathedral on Sunday, 7th August. Please keep them in your prayers and encourage them to faithfully practice their faith.

The parish extends congratulations to Oliver Francis and his family on the occasion of Oliver's Confirmation this Sunday. Oliver was prepared for the Sacrament with the other children of the parish, but because of the family's impending move overseas, he is unable to receive the Sacrament at St. Mary's Cathedral on the 7th of August. I was able to administer the Sacrament of Confirmation with delegation by the Bishop.
