A LONELY PLACE: During the Second World War when the axis enemy were falling back, they were said to be making a retreat. If, on the other hand, our allies fell back, we would more likely be told that it was a strategic withdrawal. There is all the difference between the two. The former implies running away; the latter means a gathering of strength to advance more quickly and effectively. This may be done by resting the troops, taking up a better position or by waiting for fresh reinforcements.

Christians sometimes speak of making a retreat when they retire to some house for prayer and quiet. The word retreat here is not a good one; a strategic withdrawal is much better. It is what Christ loved to do. In today's Gospel he says to his disciples: Come away by yourselves to a lonely place and rest awhile. Christ loved to get away at times from the pressures that bore down on him, from the noise and the crowds and the constant calls upon him. In quiet places he prayed and gained refreshment of spirit and strength to carry on his word through communing with his Father. We too will gain great benefit from occasionally making spiritual strategic withdrawals. Up and down the country there are quiet places called retreat houses when people go to pray and get away for a time from their normal occupations. The purpose is to retire apart from the noisy distractions of life. It is going to a quiet place to be alone with Christ to pray. It is listening like Elijah on the mountain, for the voice of God in the gently whispering air. It is getting into personal touch with him who made our very being in the silence of a retreat house we contemplate such questions as "Why was I made?" "Why do I exist?" "What is my purpose in life?" We think of the wonderful works of God in our redemption and salvation, and we do our best to draw nearer to Christ and understand more about his wonderful personality.

However, funerals are permitted with a limit of 10 attendees.

Weddings, however, are not permitted.

Baptisms *are not permitted*, except in case of emergency. Similarly, the anointing of the sick, and sick calls generally, are permitted in case of emergency only.

It seems clear that, because the new Delta strain of Covid virus is so infectious, we are being asked to be even more cautious than during the previous lockdown. "Stay home" means "avoid all unnecessary contact with other people."

During the lockdown, the Sunday Mass will be live streamed on YouTube, and you are encouraged to connect prayerfully to this medium. The streaming will begin at 5pm on Saturday and can be accessed at any time after the Mass has concluded.
