### 14<sup>th</sup> March 2021 – Fourth Sunday in Lent

**During the Fridays in Lent, Stations of the Cross will be held in the Church at 7.30pm. This is a good way to observe our Lenten Journey by Journeying with Our Lord in his passion and cross.**

**GOD SO LOVED THE WORLD:** One of the amazing facts about the tremendous sufferings and death of Our Lord is that it has become for Christians the supreme revelation and proof of God's love. And yet on a human level one would expect the opposite. It would seem to be a complete denial of God's very existence, to say nothing of his love. After all what makes faith difficult are life's cruelties, hatreds, injustices, and all these are concentrated on Calvary. The concentration camps of Nazi Germany and the Gulags of Stalinist Russia filled people with horror and revulsion and yet here it is all on Calvary – the atrocious torture of a Jew with the noblest of personalities. Why then does the Christian not recoil from such happening? Why does he not turn away in disgust and horror and say “If there were a God he would not allow this?” The answer is given in today's Gospel – *God so loved the world that he gave his only Son that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life.*

It is love that draws the Christian to the cross because he knows that love embraced the cross. Christ said *If I be lifted up, I will draw all to myself.* The whole of Scripture is the story of God's communicating love. God spoke out of the darkness of history to his people binding them to himself in a covenant of love and in its pages, he expresses his love in language that is both beautiful and endearing. This shared covenant of love grew closer as history developed until it finally broke down the partition that divided his people from himself by the coming of his Son among them. Christ is the overwhelming proof then of God's love for us all. Christ was the incarnation of a love that was both infinite and eternal. His love went to such lengths that it set the world on fire and its sparks have enkindled flames that have warmed the hearts of all. His death was the supreme giving and sharing of love. Love was lifted up on a cross so that all might be united with that love.

**Parish 2020 – A Call for Renewal** On the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, 12<sup>th</sup> December, 2020, Archbishop Anthony Fisher launched our new Archdiocesan Mission Plan *Go Make Disciples* which, with the assistance of the Sydney Centre for Evangelisation, seeks to inspire and support the renewal of our parishes as places of encounter with the living Christ for the faithful and beyond.

In the weeks and months ahead, we will all join together in prayer, calling on the Holy Spirit, to prepare the hearts of each of us and of all our parishes and Eucharistic communities to receive anew the fire of God's love and the desire to be ever more faithful witnesses of Jesus Christ. A summary of the Mission Plan is available in the porch of the Church.

**YEAR OF ST JOSEPH:** This year has been designated by Pope Francis as the Year of St. Joseph. This is significant for the Parish as it is under the patronage of St. Joseph. St. Joseph's Feast Day will be celebrated on the 19<sup>th</sup> March and we pray that under his patronage and protection, our Parish will grow and prosper with a resurgence of faith and devotion to the Mass and Sacraments.

**Imposition of restrictions concerning Churches:** From Friday, 12<sup>th</sup> February, an unlimited number of people can attend Mass, provided that the one person per 2 metre square rule is observed. However, our Church will only hold at least eighty according to this regulation, any overflow would have to be accommodated in the Marion Hall where the Mass can be viewed on the TV monitor. Because of the easing of the restrictions, the Archbishop has lifted the dispensation from our Sunday Mass obligation. *Parishioners are once again obliged to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of obligation when this is reasonably possible.* Those of great age, have health conditions or are otherwise anxious about the risks of Covid19 are free to remain at home and find another way of keeping the Sabbath holy. There is still the requirement of taking names and contact details of attendees. The use of a QR code is recommended for those with iPhones or smart phones. The NSW Services app would need to be install on your phone to access the code. The first time you use the code, it will ask you to provide your name and contact number. It will then send you a code to enter with your details and the app will then be active. It is then used every time you attend Mass, or when and where you visit other venues that have a QR code registration system in place.

The wearing of masks is no longer mandatory, but strongly recommended where social distancing is not possible. They are, however, still mandatory when travelling on public transport.

Parishioners who elect to attend Mass during the pandemic should consider the safety of other parishioners by staying away if they are unwell, and if so, getting tested and self-isolating while awaiting the results. It is also advisable that parishioners only attend Mass in their own parish and not move from parish to parish.

Confessions are now available before the 5 pm Vigil Mass (4 pm to 4.45 pm).
