## 25<sup>th</sup> OCTOBER, 2020 – THIRTIETH SUNDAY OF ORDINARY TIME

**LOVING GOD IN OTHERS:** Christ said that his command that all should love others is like his command that they should love God. One kind of love is involved in the other. In fact, the one kind should become the other. There is a solidarity in the human race arising from their common origin in God and their common redemption by Christ. Because of this latter, we are all united in a mystic union. God willed that the incarnation should become, in some real sense, a reincarnation in every person so that all should relive in their lives the life of Christ. For Christ, when he died upon the cross, and rose again from the tomb, had not only is physical body, but a new mystical body of which he desired that all should be members.

Fundamentally then the reason whey we should love our neighbour is because we see the divine Christ in them. It is Christ who lives in under-developed countries, who is homeless, hungry and naked; it is Christ who lives in slum conditions with no proper roof over his head or normal human amenities. It is Christ who suffers in hospitals, who has cancer or is crippled or blind. It is Christ who is old and lonely with no friends and little money. The last Vatican Council stressed the importance of love of others. In the document on the Church it said: *To those who believe in divine love, Christ give assurance that the way of love lies open to all, and that the effort to establish a universal brotherhood is not a hopeless one.* It cautions them, at the same time, that this love is not something to be reserved for important matters but must be pursued chiefly in the ordinary circumstances of life. Everyone in their daily dealings with people must come across plenty of instances where they could show love to someone in need.

**Imposition of restrictions concerning Churches.** From Friday, 23<sup>rd</sup> October, restrictions on Church attendance have been eased. There is now a limit of 300 people who can attend Mass, provided the 4 square metre per person rule is adhered to. However, our Church will hold at least forty persons according to this regulation, any overflow would have to be accommodated in the Marion Hall. There is still the requirement of taking names and contact details of attendees.

The Government has recommended the wearing of face masks when people are in crowded places, such as shopping centres, supermarkets, public transport, and *places of worship*. This is not mandatory, but strongly recommended given the length of time people are together at Mass.

Parishioners who elect to attend Mass during the pandemic should consider the safety of other parishioners by staying away if they are unwell, and if so, getting tested and self-isolating while awaiting the results. It is also advisable that parishioners only attend Mass in their own parish and not move from parish to parish.

Please note, with the social distancing rule, only a maximum of fifty persons can be accommodated in the Church.

Confessions are now available before the 5 pm Vigil Mass (4 pm to 4.45 pm).
