GRATITUDE: A fable has it that a spider made its way down from the ceiling of a room by a single thread and spun its web on a lower level. There it grew fat, sleek and self-satisfied until one day as it was moving about its web it saw the single tread stretching down from on high. Stupidly it gazed at it and said: "What's the use of that?" and broke it. Immediately all its web collapsed, and the spider was sent hurtling down into the depths below.



That fable is a parable of peoples' lives. manv They have come from on high, have made comfortable position for themselves, have become complacent egocentric that they have forgotten the connection between themselves and God. They do not realise that the whole of their existence depends upon

the single thread of the will of God. They do not grasp the fact that the thread is their life-line, that they depend upon it for every step they take, every breath they breathe, every morsel of food they eat. But every now and again, God gives a jerk to the life-line – something unpleasant happens, illness perhaps or loss of money. For a short while they turn to him for help. But then, when the trouble vanishes, with it goes the

memory of what has been done for them. The nine lepers in Today's Gospel had something of this attitude. Their terrible disease caused them to turn to Christ for help, but once they were cured, they went their way without a word of thanks to their benefactor. The lesson for us is obvious. Like the leper who returned, we must be thankful for God's benefits. Prayers of thanksgiving are far less self-centred. They help our hearts to expand, to get rid of what is narrow in our makeup, to look outward away from self to God. We should not let a day pass without thanking God for all the good things he has given us. We should even have the courage to thank him for the hard things which put us to the test.


