CORPUS CHRISTI: Today's feast is at the very central core of Christianity. Like and electric current the force of Christ's words at a supper which took place twenty centuries ago has penetrated throughout the world. They have been a unifying force bringing people together into a unity of belief and love. This power emanating from what appears to be bread and wine has been the greatest cohesive force in Christianity. It is this Body of Christ offered up on the altars of the world for the last two thousand years that has kept Christianity intact and brought folk of every class and nationality together into an allegiance of worship and a common membership of a kingdom of which Christ is king.

The effect of those few words and actions of Christ at that supper has been truly amazing. Today they take place all over the world. Because of them countless churches, chapels and cathedrals have sprung up, lives have been dedicated to them, and lives laid down for them. All kinds of hardship and acts of heroism have been undergone for them, and because of them millions of lives have been transformed.

Christ's words and actions of long ago have convinced us that he still lives and reigns in our midst. We know that his great act of sacrificial love is still commemorated, not just as an historical event, but as a living force at work among us. Christ did not die intestate. He made his last will and covenant on the night before he died. All humankind was his beneficiaries since he left himself to them in sacramental and sacrificial form to be with them forever. "Jesus, knowing that his last hour had come, having loved his own who were in the world, he loved them to the end". This is the Lord's gift to us before he left us. This most precious and abiding gift of his love asks us in return faith in him and his words. ***"He who eats my flesh and drinks my blood abides in me and I in him, and I will raise him up on the Last Day."***
