PLACES OF HONOUR: The Cure of Ars once said "I received two letter s by the same post; one said that I was a great saint, and the other that I was a hypocrite and an imposter. The first added nothing to me, and the second took nothing away from me. We are what we are before God, and nothing more". Egotistical persons like to push themselves forward. They love to be in the limelight. They are the kind of people about whom Our Lord is speaking that take it for granted they are going to sit in the places of honour at a feast, so they push others aside. But such a one is not great in God's eyes. They take a very low place in his estimation.

All of us must try to see ourselves as God sees us. In one sense we are worthless. We are dust as we hear on Ash Wednesday. Yet there is another sense in which we are great and important. But this is so only when we recognize that this is the work of God. He took hold of worthless dust and gave it value by making it to his own image and likeness. Our Lord tells us today: Everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted. We can only exalt ourselves with God's help. If we attempt to lift ourselves up by our own efforts we are bound to fall, we must have the humility to see that without Christ we can do nothing. The proud persons are so full of themselves that there is no room for God in their lives. They are the ones who will eventually be humbled. We must, as the Cure said, put ourselves in the right relationship with God; then we will be our true selves and worthy to be exalted. Our Lord gave us the example of this himself; He emptied himself coming down in the form of a servant. He continually humbled himself. But in the end, he was raised up and every knee in heaven, on earth and under the earth bowed down before him.


