THE FOOLISH AND THE WEAK: Superficially, Our Lord's words during his sermon on the mountain-side sound foolish. They seem to be advocating what is contrary to common sense. How can poverty of spirit, meekness, the willing suffering of persecution, be a source of power? Surely the very opposite is the case. This would certainly be accepted by the Caiphases, Herods and Pilates in Our Lord's day. Yet the history of Christianity has proved the opposite. *God has chosen, in St. Paul's words, the weak in the world to shame the strong.*

Who would have thought it possible that a few fishermen in an out-of-the-way province of a great empire would light a fire that would burn, not only in the heart of Rome, but would spread far and wide throughout the world and would never be extinguished.

Christ's words have again and again shown their power, The early Christians martyrs' cry: "You slay us but we conquer by your slaying," revealed the fact that suffering for justice's sake can become the seed of a powerful growth. The lives of many saints provide more proof of the truth of what Christ said. One has only to think of the influence for good that the poor man Francis of Assisi has had, or a Bernadette, whose innocence, poverty, and weakness drew Our Lady to Lourdes and the immense spiritual good that has resulted. It makes one think of those other words of St. Paul: *The wisdom of God is wiser than men and the weakness of God is more powerful than men.* And the supreme example of those words is Christ himself. He was poor, was led like a lamb to the slaughter. He humbled himself even to death on the cross, he suffered persecution and as a result of it all has become the most powerful force in the world. *If I be lifted up, he said, I will draw all to myself.*
