UNITY IN CHRIST: The mass media has brought the various parts of the world very close together. Now we can sit in our armchairs and watch events on our television screen taking place on the other side of the equator. Satellite coverage of the earth can give pictures almost instantaneously in our news bulletins. We can see refugees being driven from their homes and living in terrible conditions, can watch starving people lying in the streets of war torn places and third world cities, and can gaze at the horrible aftermath of natural disasters. But though in sight and sound the world has become united, it is still very disunited in other ways. There is hatred between nations, industrial strife, huge differences between wealth and poverty. There is, in other words, much seeming unity externally, together with a great deal of dissension internally.

Today we are keeping the feast of the Holy Family. It is the feast of a little united family whose union is based on its greatest member, Our Lord, Jesus Christ. What God wanted was that this family would broaden out into a world-wide family, a family of his own people. For just as Jesus was the unifying force of the family of Nazareth, so must he be for the wide-world family. This has indeed grown immensely in the last two thousand years and the work of winning new members still goes on. What Christ wants is that the whole human race be brought into membership. If this were to happen, we would surely see vastly different pictures on our television screens. There would, of course, still be plenty of problems and troubles. There are bound to be, between human beings. Love of Christ does not eliminate all these. But at least they would be approached without bitterness and hatred. The angels sang *Pease on earth to people who are God's friends*. There would indeed be a far greater peace amongst nations who loved Christ. Differences would be solved in a spirit of goodwill and justice.

THE CHRISTMAS CRIB: During the last week of Advent and during the Christmas Season, a feature of our churches is the Christmas Crib. The custom reputedly goes back to St. Francis of Assisi, who is thought of having made the first model of the Crib at Greccio in 1223. The figure of the Child Jesus is placed in the manger during the first Mass of Christmas, on Christmas Eve, and the figures of the Magi are added on the Feast of The Epiphany (3rd January).

Parish 2020 – A Call for Renewal On the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, 12th December, 2020, Archbishop Anthony Fisher launched our new Archdiocesan Mission Plan *Go Make Disciples* which, with the assistance of the Sydney Centre for Evangelisation, seeks to inspire and support the renewal of our parishes as places of encounter with the living Christ for the faithful and beyond.

In the weeks and months ahead we will all join together in prayer, calling on the Holy Spirit, to prepare the hearts of each of us and of all our parishes and Eucharistic communities to receive anew the fire of God's love and the desire to be ever more faithful witnesses of Jesus Christ. A summary of the Mission Plan is available in the porch of the Church.

Imposition of restrictions concerning Churches. From Sunday, 20th December, the former restrictions on Church attendance have been re-imposed due to a spike in Covid infections in the Northern Peninsular and Greater Sydney. There is a limit of 300 people who can attend Mass, provided a 4 square metre per person rule is adhered to. However, our Church will

only hold at least forty persons according to this regulation, any overflow would have to be accommodated in the Marion Hall. There is still the requirement of taking names and contact details of attendees.

The Government has strongly recommended the wearing of face masks when people are in crowded places, such a shopping centres, supermarkets, public transport, and *places of worship.* This is not mandatory, but strongly recommended given the length of time people are together at Mass.

Parishioners who elect to attend Mass during the pandemic should consider the safety of other parishioners by staying away if they are unwell, and if so, getting tested and selfisolating while awaiting the results. It is also advisable that parishioners only attend Mass in their own parish and not move from parish to parish.

Confessions are now available before the 5 pm Vigil Mass (4 pm to 4.45 pm).
