Monday is the Solemnity of All Saints, and Tuesday is the Commemoration of All Souls. The month of November is traditionally the month of the Holy Souls, and all my Masses will be offered for all your deceased relatives and friends.

LOVE OF GOD AND MAN: We all belong to a human community and as such have no right to try and opt out of it. We cannot and should not try to make ourselves divisible from our brothers and sisters. *The man who loves God must be one who loves his brother as well* wrote St. John. The refusal to acknowledge this duty of love will result in the contraction of the personality. Instead of love there will be only selfishness, self-love, and isolation. Christ said that the greatest commandment is to love God with all one's strength and one's neighbour as oneself. The love of others is by no means always easy. There is a legend that Abraham one day was visited in the desert by an Arab who complained loudly about his host's food, wine, and lodging. Finally, Abraham got fed up and was about to get rid of him.

At that moment God appeared and said “Abraham, I have stood this man for forty years, can’t you put up with him for one day?” That legend, though expecting rather a lot from human nature at least is an expression of the universality of love. It should be extended even to the difficult and ungrateful. After all Christ did say: *love your enemies, do good to those who hate you.*

We should wish all well, should desire, not only their spiritual welfare but also their temporal in so far as it helps them on their way to salvation. We should try to realise that all people are created by God in his own image and likeness and that Christ shed his blood for them and desires to live in them. Our love then both for God and our brothers and sisters should not be confined to desires or words, it must show itself in action even at the cost of self-sacrifice. *It is not those who say Lord, Lord, who will enter the kingdom of heaven, said Our blessed Lord, it is those who do the will of my Father in Heaven.* There are so many opportunities of showing love in action. The poor, the lonely, the elderly, the sick, to mention only a few, call for a loving response. Like the good Samaritan we must do our best to bring joy into their lives.

CHURCH RE-OPENING

With the news that NSW has now reached 80% double vaccination the Sydney Archdiocese has advised that, public Masses and other services are able to recommence for all who wish to attend.

So it is with great excitement that we can let you know that our church is now open for weekday Masses and Sunday Masses at 5pm (Saturday Vigil), 8am and 10am, Sundays. We look forward to warmly welcoming everyone back in the weeks to come.

As the 1 person per 4sqm rule will apply, there can only be a maximum of 40 people in the church for each Mass. To help with numbers, we will also be opening Marion Hall for the Saturday Vigil Mass and the Sunday Mass. People there will be able to view the livestreamed Mass and receive Holy Communion. This venue is limited to 20 people.

When you arrive for Mass at the Church or the Hall, you will also need to use the QR code OR use the 'pen and paper' system for official registration. This is the NSW Government compliance requirement.

It has been previously announced that everyone, whether fully vaccinated, partially vaccinated, or unvaccinated, will be able to attend Mass. We will be doing all that is reasonably possible to keep everyone safe who comes to Mass. There will be mask-wearing, good ventilation, hand sanitiser available, the enforcing of social distancing and cleaning of the church between Masses.
