CHRIST AND WORRY: We live in a pep-pill age – and age of sedatives, energy drinks and pick-me-ups. Pills and medications of many kinds have become the antidote to anxiety-complexes, fear-fixations, work-tensions, worry in its multiple forms. They have become the recognised remedy for heartaches, headaches and most of the other aches which affect the human body and spirit. They are the tonic for the neurotic, the balm for the balmy, the narcotic for the sleepless. Millions of these pills are poured down human throats every day. Tranquillisers certainly have their place in curing human troubles, ills and anxieties, but their indiscriminate use should have no place at all.

So many unnecessary worries arise from a false philosophy of life or from a wrong way of living. Sometimes it is because a person tries to live on a purely material level without giving any outlet to their spiritual nature. "Man cannot live by bread alone", if he attempts to do so disaster can easily follow. Christ, on the eve of his departure, told his apostles "Let not your hearts be troubled; believe in God, believe also in me". They had every reason to be sad; no doubt they felt the impending loss of leadership. They were bewildered, not knowing what was going to happen to them. Christ was telling them not to worry but to have confidence in him and in the providence of God.

This is a lesson we can all do well to learn. It is a lesson of peace of heart. The best tranquilliser in the world is prayer especially prayer of complete trust in God. This is a great help in creating that deep-down peace that is a requisite for good bodily and spiritual health. Christ said, "I am the Way, the Truth and the Life". If we really believe that it should give us a tremendous confidence and strength of purpose, and hence far fewer pills to swallow.
