**St Joseph's Church is open from 7 am to 6 pm daily, and the usual Mass timetable as above apply. We look forward to seeing everyone at Mass.**

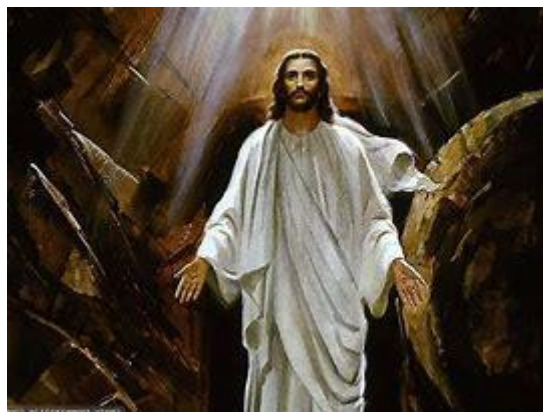

**THE FEAST OF LIGHT:** The Church's liturgy at this time of the year is full of the theme of light. The Easter fire struck from a flint, the Paschal candle, the procession with candles and the sudden illumination of the church at the Easter vigil all symbolise the shining splendour of the risen Christ. Three times the words are sung "Lumen Christi" (The Light of Christ) as the candle shows the way through the darkness. And in the great hymn, the Exultet, the priest sings "Be glad, let earth be glad, as glory floods her, ablaze with light from her eternal King, let all corners of the earth be glad, knowing an end to gloom and darkness."

Christ then is the external light. He came to illuminate every man and woman who comes into the world. His radiance will be reflected in every Christian. In every Christian, Easter is perpetuated since in Christ every Christian will rise to a new life of glory. Thus St. Peter could write: *But you are a chosen race, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, that you may declare the wonderful deeds of him who called you out of darkness into his marvellous light.* Christian imagination has loved to see in the sunrise which the women saw as they made their way to the tomb in which Christ was buried, a symbol of the Light who rose from the tomb and shed his light across the world. Once all over Europe men and women would, from some vantage point, watch the sunrise on Easter morning. That moment of dawn was marked by the ringing of bells and the singing of choirs to greet the rising sun as a symbol of the risen Christ. Without the risen Christ the world would indeed be dark and a hopeless place; he has made it a world of hope and love; a place of encouragement for us all. He has dispersed the darkness of the mystery surrounding the purpose of human existence. In his light now we see light!

**Happy Easter to all! Our greetings today should be "Christ is Risen! He is risen indeed, Alleluia!"**
