21st March 2021 – Fifth Sunday in Lent

During the Fridays in Lent, Stations of the Cross will be held in the Church at 7.30pm. This is a good way to observe our Lenten Journey by Journeying with Our Lord in his passion and cross.

DEATH AND LIFE: Death and resurrection are the theme of today's Gospel. Christ said: *The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified.* The death of Christ was both a tragedy and a triumph. It was a thing of horror because it was the result of sin; it was a thing of glory because it was the victory over sin. The cross, like a plant, was plunged deep into mud, and, like a plant, burst forth into blossom in the sunlight. The cross dug into the dust of which human beings were made, gave the dust a golden future. For the Christ who was so beaten and disfigured by pain was to unite himself with the human dust and rise with it in splendour.

Thus, death and resurrection are the lot of all Christians. The joy of being a Christian arises from our union with Christ. *The glory you have given to me I have given to them* were Christ's words to his Father at the last supper. They are true of all of us. We have risen with Christ. His splendour radiates through our being. He has taken hold of our mortal life and made it immortal. His death and resurrection have resulted in the happiness of millions. They have become the spur to faith and hope. *If you believe in me, he said, you will never die.* What a tremendous strength such words should give us when we are confronted with troubles and suffering. They should impart a warmth and a courage to the adventure of living and a confidence in the face of death. We are, after all, only emigrants returning to the place of our birth. *He who loves his life loses it.* Christ said. If we become so self-centred that what Christ did for us means nothing to us then, to quote Christ again *we lose our life.* Christ did everything for us; we should devote our lives to him in return. It would indeed be foolish to spurn Christ who is *The Resurrection and the Life*; for that would be to destroy our own life for which he died.

Parish 2020 – A Call for Renewal On the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, 12th December, 2020, Archbishop Anthony Fisher launched our new Archdiocesan Mission Plan *Go Make Disciples* which, with the assistance of the Sydney Centre for Evangelisation, seeks to inspire and support the renewal of our parishes as places of encounter with the living Christ for the faithful and beyond.

In the weeks and months ahead, we will all join together in prayer, calling on the Holy Spirit, to prepare the hearts of each of us and of all our parishes and Eucharistic communities to receive anew the fire of God's love and the desire to be ever more faithful witnesses of Jesus Christ. A summary of the Mission Plan is available in the porch of the Church.

YEAR OF ST JOSEPH: This year has been designated by Pope Francis as the Year of St. Joseph. This is significant for the Parish as it is under the patronage of St. Joseph. We pray that under his patronage and protection, our Parish will grow and prosper with a resurgence of faith and devotion to the Mass and Sacraments. Bishop Terry Brady, who is an old boy of Oatley parish send us his greetings for the Feast Day of Parish dedicated to St. Joseph.

Imposition of restrictions concerning Churches: From Friday, 12th February, an unlimited number of people can attend Mass, provided that the one person per 2 metre square rule is observed. However, our Church will only hold at least eighty according to this regulation, any overflow would have to be accommodated in the Marion Hall where the Mass can be viewed on the TV monitor. Because of the easing of the restrictions, the Archbishop has lifted the dispensation from our Sunday Mass obligation. *Parishioners are once again obliged to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of obligation when this is reasonably possible.* Those of great age, have health conditions or are otherwise anxious about the risks of Covid19 are free to remain at home and find another way of keeping the Sabbath holy. There is still the requirement of taking names and contact details of attendees. The use of a QR code is recommended for those with iPhones or smart phones. The NSW Services app would need to be install on your phone to access the code. The first time you use the code, it will ask you to provide your name and contact number. It will then send you a code to enter with your details and the app will then be active. It is then used every time you attend Mass, or when and where you visit other venues that have a QR code registration system in place.

The wearing of masks is no longer mandatory, but strongly recommended where social distancing is not possible. They are, however, still mandatory when travelling on public transport.

Parishioners who elect to attend Mass during the pandemic should consider the safety of other parishioners by staying away if they are unwell, and if so, getting tested and self-isolating while awaiting the results. It is also advisable that parishioners only attend Mass in their own parish and not move from parish to parish.

Confessions are now available before the 5 pm Vigil Mass (4 pm to 4.45 pm).
