COMPASSION: One cold day a trembling old man was brought into the court over which Fiorello La Guardia (Mayor of New York) was presiding. M He was accused of stealing a loaf of bread. His family, he said, was starving. "I've got to punish you", said the Mayor. "I can do nothing but fine your ten dollars." At the same time, he reached into his pocket and said: "Well, here's the ten dollars to pay your fine. And now I remit the fine. Furthermore" he declared, "I am going to fine everybody in the courtroom 50 cents for living in a town where a

man has to steal bread in order to eat." The had was passed round and an incredulous old man left the courtroom with a stake of 47 dollars and 50 cents.

No one can deny that the Mayor acted in a very Christian fashion, that his compassion took a good practical form. There are those who would have acted very differently. For them stealing would be stealing and deserve punishment. Some starving people are shot for looting. The Pharisees acted in a very different way from the Mayor. They condemned the woman taken in adultery. They had no feeling for human weakness. For them the law was the law, and due punishment for breaking it must be administered. Compassion never entered their heads. Christ soon showed them their hypocrisy. He might well have said: *People who live in glass houses should not throw stones*. What right had they to throw stones at the woman when they themselves were in a worse state than she was? Her sin was a sin of human frailty, theirs was worse, because it arose from pride.

Our Lord's attitude towards human weakness is one of love and readiness to forgive. He knows that we can so easily fail him. The psalmist says: *He knows our frame; he knows we are but dust*. Dust is easily blown about by the wind. Human dust is so often at the mercy of prevailing moods and desires. The woman in the Gospel must have felt great sorrow for what she had done. This pleased Our Lord. It is what he wants from us to earn forgiveness.

THE SEASON OF LENT: Lent is a penitential season of prayer, self-denial and helping others (almsgiving). In this way, the whole Church prepares for Easter with those who are to be baptised. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. The law of fasting binds those who have completed their *eighteenth* year, until the beginning of their *sixtieth* year. The law of abstinence binds those who have completed their *fourteenth* year. The rationale behind the Church's law is an invitation for us to join ourselves to Jesus in his forty days of self-denial in the desert. As we imitate our Saviour, we confront our own human weakness and remind ourselves of the brevity of life and our need for salvation which only comes through faith and imitation of Christ.

The Pascal precept binds all Catholics to receive Holy Communion at least once a year between Ash Wednesday and Trinity Sunday. The faithful are also obliged to confess their grave (mortal) sins individually in the Sacrament of Penance at least once a year.

The practice of almsgiving during Lent is recommended by contribution to Project Compassion. Project Compassion Boxes and Envelopes are available this Sunday in the foyer of the Church

Stations of the Cross: This beautiful devotion apt for the season of Lent will be conducted in the Church **each Friday during Lent at 7 pm**. Come and walk the journey in memory of Christ crucified.
