REDEMPTION: A small boy made a boat to sail on a near-by pond. It sailed beautifully till one day it hit a jagged piece of rock and sank. A few days later a man salvaged the boat and sold it to a junk shop. The boy happened to pass the shop one day and saw the boat. He went in and said to the shopkeeper: “That’s my boat”. “No, it isn’t, son,” said the

shopkeeper, “look at the ticket on it”. The boy went home and started a job to earn some money and with it bought the boat. As he came out of the shop someone heard him say quietly to himself: “You are my boat twice – I made you and I bought you”. We all belong to God twice. He made us and when we met with disaster because of sin, he bought us back by his death on the cross. St. Peter tells us this. He says: *You were not bought by corruptible things such as gold and silver. but with the precious blood of Christ.* And today’s Gospel ends with the words: *For the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve and to give his life as a ransom for many.*

But we must not look upon redemption as a buying back from the devil as though we were slaves in a marketplace with the devil as our owner and Our Lord offering him money for our release. Redemption means that the blood of Christ made it possible for us who were in sin to be won back to the friendship of God. Christ has, in other words, *Brought us out of darkness into his marvellous light.* There is then a very real sense in which we can say that the price that Christ paid to conquer sin in us was his sufferings, death, and resurrection. This will, of course, only be true if we play our part in the work of redemption. Our Lord asked the apostles: *Are you able to drink the cup that I drink or to be baptized with the baptism with which I am baptized?* Our answer must be that in some way we can. We must open our hearts to Christ even though at times this will involve self-denial and personal hurt.

The NSW Department of Education will also advise schools to inform families of the availability of these resources.

Closure of Churches due to the recent spread of the Corona virus.

From Saturday, 26th June 2021, Greater Sydney (which includes the Blue Mountains, Central Coast, Wollongong, and Shellharbour) went into lockdown. Consequently, the Church has been closed until further notice (refer to recent changes, below).

However, funerals are permitted with a limit of 100 attendees, in addition to those essential for the service (celebrant, undertakers, musician/singer, streaming operator).

Weddings are now permitted for groups: 100 guests, in addition to those necessary for the liturgy (i.e. the couple, the two witnesses, the celebrant and probably a musician/singer, and photographer).

If you are fully vaccinated you can attend a funeral or a wedding, so long as the capacity limit is not exceeded, currently, the 4 square metre rule must be observed. The capacity limit for St Joseph's Oatley is 60 people.

The Premier has now announced recent changes in relation to the easing of Covid restrictions. The following summarises the key changes and the approach we will take in Sydney Archdiocese, but no doubt further updates will be needed in the coming weeks. Not everything is clear yet!

Firstly, along with other Faith Groups, we are very grateful that, in her Covid Roadmap announcement, the Premier recognised that for people of faith worship is more like an essential service than a recreation. We now eagerly look forward to the opportunity to gather once more to celebrate our faith and give thanks to God. The re-opening of places of worship

will be staged in line with the NSW Government Roadmap. These are the details as we presently understand them.

STAGE ONE – WHEN 70% ARE VACCINATED – ESTIMATED DATE 11 OCTOBER

The first stage commences when 70% of eligible people are fully vaccinated – this is expected to be 11 October. Even though we would be entitled on this date to open churches to the vaccinated only, following his recent consultation with us, the Archbishop has decided that **we will patiently wait the estimated two further weeks until we reach 80% fully vaccinated before re-opening our churches to the public**, and conducting public Masses etc. However, during this first stage, priests who are themselves fully vaccinated will be able to conduct ceremonies such as Baptisms for families that are fully vaccinated (apart from children not yet eligible for vaccination).

STAGE TWO – WHEN 80% ARE FULLY VACCINATED – ESTIMATED DATE 25 OCTOBER

At 80% fully vaccinated we will open our churches and ceremonies to “mixed” congregations (fully vaccinated, partially vaccinated and yet unvaccinated); the 4 sqm rule will apply, and masks must be worn indoors. We will not be required to check a person’s vaccination status. We continue to urge everyone to be vaccinated, and so to reduce their risk of infection. People who are especially vulnerable, who are vaccinated but anxious about mixing with the unvaccinated, or who are unvaccinated and do not want to risk contact with others, are free to remain at home and live-streaming of Masses will continue.

STAGE THREE – WHEN 90% ARE EXPECTED TO BE FULLY VACCINATED – 1 DECEMBER 2021 – “THE NEW NORMAL”

The Government has advised that from 1 December there will be no difference between the Covid safety requirements for all NSW citizens, whether fully vaccinated, partially vaccinated, or unvaccinated. The key requirement for churches will be the **2sqm rule at all indoor religious gatherings**, including weddings and funerals. There will be **no limit on the numbers at outdoor events**, and so outdoor Masses will be an option. Covid Safe plans will be required for outdoor events with more than 1,000 people. At weddings, dancing will be permitted, as well as eating and drinking while standing up.

Once we have reached stage three masks will not be required inside a church (though some people may wish to wear a mask for added protection).

During the restrictions, the Sunday Mass will be live streamed on YouTube, and you are encouraged to connect prayerfully to this medium. The streaming will begin at 5pm on Saturday and can be accessed at any time after the Mass has concluded.

Mass will also be streamed on Thursdays at 12 md during school term for the teachers and children of St. Joseph's School who are at School or at home with their parents.
