PEACE OF SOUL: Three times in today's Gospel Christ says *Peace be with you*. His salutation was more than a polite form of welcome. It was an offer of grace, of that peace of which he spoke at the last supper *My peace I give you; not as the world gives do I give you*. Twice he spoke the words to his apostles who were hidden away behind shut doors for fear of the Jews. Christ not only dispersed their fears but also, by his presence and the showing of his wounds imparted a deep-down calmness of spirit allied with a profound joy. On a second occasion he offered peace to doubting Thomas. It was a peace which was the product of a faith learned at Christ's feet.

There can be no peace from Christ without faith. Faith is the response that must be given to Christ's offer of peace. It is the open door to peace, and the greater the faith the more profound will be the peace. Christ is the healer of the divisions within a person, or discords between head, and heart, and senses. His peace is not a religious narcotic. It does not anaesthetise action. On the contrary it is a strength to action, a powerful help to the endurance of life's difficulties. In the modern world this peace is at a discount. Tensions, restlessness, neurosis of various kinds afflict many people; an inner chaos of mind and heart created by confusion about the purpose of living and insecurity result in much unhappiness. The antidote to all this is peace of soul, but this is not easily won. On a natural level much can be done by learning how to relax, perhaps by listening to music or enjoying some other form of entertainment. A good holiday can clearly work wonders. But at a deeper level the peace that Christ offers has a more profound effect. Christ said *Come to me, all who labour and are heavily burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me; for I am gentle and lowly in heart and you will find rest for your souls*.

Parish 2020 – A Call for Renewal On the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, 12th December, 2020, Archbishop Anthony Fisher launched our new Archdiocesan Mission Plan *Go Make Disciples* which, with the assistance of the Sydney Centre for Evangelisation, seeks to inspire and support the renewal of our parishes as places of encounter with the living Christ for the faithful and beyond.

In the weeks and months ahead, we will all join together in prayer, calling on the Holy Spirit, to prepare the hearts of each of us and of all our parishes and Eucharistic communities to receive anew the fire of God's love and the desire to be ever more faithful witnesses of Jesus Christ. A summary of the Mission Plan is available in the porch of the Church.

Imposition of restrictions concerning Churches: From Friday, 12th February, an unlimited number of people can attend Mass, provided that the one person per 2 metre square rule is observed. However, our Church will only hold at least eighty according to this regulation, any overflow would have to be accommodated in the Marion Hall where the Mass can be viewed on the TV monitor. Because of the easing of the restrictions, the Archbishop has lifted the dispensation from our Sunday Mass obligation. ***Parishioners are once again obliged to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of obligation when this is reasonably possible.*** Those of great age, have health conditions or are otherwise anxious about the risks of Covid19 are free to remain at home and find another way of keeping the Sabbath holy. There is still the requirement of taking names and contact details of attendees. The use of a QR code is recommended for those with iPhones or smart phones. The NSW Services app would need to be install on your phone to access the code. The first time you use the code, it will ask you to provide your name and contact number. It will then send you a code to enter with your details and the app will then be active. It is then used every time you attend Mass, or when and where you visit other venues that have a QR code registration system in place.

The wearing of masks is no longer mandatory, but strongly recommended where social distancing is not possible. They are, however, still mandatory when travelling on public transport.

Parishioners who elect to attend Mass during the pandemic should consider the safety of other parishioners by staying away if they are unwell, and if so, getting tested and self-isolating while awaiting the results. It is also advisable that parishioners only attend Mass in their own parish and not move from parish to parish.

Confessions are now available before the 5 pm Vigil Mass (4 pm to 4.45 pm).

7. That the dead, who acknowledged Jesus as their Lord and their God, may rejoice forever with the Living One. *Let us pray to the Lord.*
8. That we may rejoice with the Blessed Virgin Mary, Queen of Heaven, that the Lord is risen indeed. **HAIL MARY.**

Almighty Father, you have given us your only begotten Son to die for our sins, and to rise again for our justification: Grant us so to put away the leaven of malice and wickedness that we may always serve you in sincerity of living and truth. We ask this through Christ our Lord. AMEN.
