### 7<sup>th</sup> March 2021 – Third Sunday in Lent

**During the Fridays in Lent, Stations of the Cross will be held in the Church at 7.30pm. This is a good way to observe our Lenten Journey by Journeying with Our Lord in his passion and cross.**

**TEMPLES:** Jewish tradition said: *He that has not seen the temple of Herod has never known what beauty is.* It was this lovely mass of snowy marble and glittering gold rising terrace upon terrace that was reduced to rubble by the invading Roman army. The historian Josephus described the setting fire to its colonnades and went on to tell how a soldier inspired “by a certain diving fury” snatched a burning brand and, lifting himself up on the shoulders of a comrade thrust the fire through a golden window and the flames ran through the holy sanctuary of God.

Christ said of himself in today's Gospel: *Destroy this temple and in three days I will build it up again.* This temple was destroyed and desecrated by unholy hands. It lay as a corpse on a cross facing the Jerusalem temple, of which he was to be the substitute. As this divine temple was being profaned the veil of the ancient temple was rent in two as a sign that the old order of things had given way to a new, and a long history had reached its climax in Christ. In him a new and glorious temple, a new priesthood and a new sacrifice came into being.

And because of this new temple of Christ *not made with hands* we too can become temples of God. St. Paul writes: *Do you not know that you are God's temple and that God's Spirit dwells in you?* Yet we know it is possible for us, like the other temples, to be destroyed. We can allow evil to desecrate it and bring it to ruin. However, we have the consolation even then of knowing that if this should happen, we can with the help of Christ, build it up again. The “bricks and cement” which keep our temple in being are prayer and our faith in the fact that: *No other foundation can any one lay than that which is laid, which is Jesus Christ.*

**Parish 2020 – A Call for Renewal** On the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe, 12<sup>th</sup> December, 2020, Archbishop Anthony Fisher launched our new Archdiocesan Mission Plan *Go Make Disciples* which, with the assistance of the Sydney Centre for Evangelisation, seeks to inspire and support the renewal of our parishes as places of encounter with the living Christ for the faithful and beyond.

In the weeks and months ahead, we will all join together in prayer, calling on the Holy Spirit, to prepare the hearts of each of us and of all our parishes and Eucharistic communities to receive anew the fire of God's love and the desire to be ever more faithful witnesses of Jesus Christ. A summary of the Mission Plan is available in the porch of the Church.

**YEAR OF ST JOSEPH:** This year has been designated by Pope Francis as the Year of St. Joseph. This is significant for the Parish as it is under the patronage of St. Joseph. St. Joseph's Feast Day will be celebrated on the 19<sup>th</sup> March and we pray that under his patronage and protection, our Parish will grow and prosper with a resurgence of faith and devotion to the Mass and Sacraments.

**Imposition of restrictions concerning Churches:** From Friday, 12<sup>th</sup> February, an unlimited number of people can attend Mass, provided that the one person per 2 metre square rule is observed. However, our Church will only hold at least eighty according to this regulation, any overflow would have to be accommodated in the Marion Hall where the Mass can be viewed on the TV monitor. Because of the easing of the restrictions, the Archbishop has lifted the dispensation from our Sunday Mass obligation. ***Parishioners are once again obliged to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of obligation when this is reasonably possible.*** Those of great age, have health conditions or are otherwise anxious about the risks of Covid19 are free to remain at home and find another way of keeping the Sabbath holy. There is still the requirement of taking names and contact details of attendees. The use of a QR code is recommended for those with iPhones or smart phones. The NSW Services app would need to be install on your phone to access the code. The first time you use the code, it will ask you to provide your name and contact number. It will then send you a code to enter with your details and the app will then be active. It is then used every time you attend Mass, or when and where you visit other venues that have a QR code registration system in place.

The wearing of masks is no longer mandatory, but strongly recommended where social distancing is not possible. They are, however, still mandatory when travelling on public transport.

Parishioners who elect to attend Mass during the pandemic should consider the safety of other parishioners by staying away if they are unwell, and if so, getting tested and self-isolating while awaiting the results. It is also advisable that parishioners only attend Mass in their own parish and not move from parish to parish.

Confessions are now available before the 5 pm Vigil Mass (4 pm to 4.45 pm).
