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## 3<sup>rd</sup> May 2020 – Fourth Sunday of Easter

**THE INDIVIDUAL:** In a modern factory, raw materials are manufactured into a finished product by a process of mass production. Millions of articles are turned out exactly similar, according to a certain size, shape and content. When God makes a human person, he does not mass produce. He is not a manufacturer – he is an artist who does not repeat himself. Of all the countless millions of men and women that he has created there have never been two the same. It is true that they have a common nature and therefore to some extent are similar in appearance, but their difference lies in that divine spiritual quality in them which makes them unique. It is for the recognition of this fact that the Catholic Church has had to fight so often through the ages. Others make humans into cogs in some harsh mechanical system whose sole occupation is to serve their iron master until they are worn out and useless.

Christ emphasises the value of each person when he speaks of himself as the Good Shepherd who knows his sheep and knows each of them by name. He loves each one to the extent that he will go after it when it is lost and will even go as far as dying of it. This then is the value of each human being that, not only are we a special creation of God, with all God's love centred on humanity, but also is the object of the death of God upon a cross. This gives us immense dignity. This should also give us great consolation. Whatever natural talents or make-up we have, however inferior in intellect or opportunity we may be in comparison with those about us, always we have the knowledge that we are the object of God's special love. Well might we pray with the psalmist exultantly *“The Lord is my shepherd and I shall not want. He makes me lie down in green pastures: he leads me beside still waters. He restores my soul: he leads me in the paths of righteousness for his name's sake. Yea, though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil: for you are with me: your rod and your staff they comfort me.”*
