20th March 2022 – Third Sunday of Lent

SECURITY: People have always sought security. That is why they have given up a nomad existence and formed themselves into nations or communities where laws can bring them peace. Today in modern states security has become very complex. States pass laws in an endeavour to secure it for their citizens. Thus, we have so called social security. This is an attempt to provide for the economic and health needs of the people. Science and technology are employed to help to give confidence against attacks from disease or various enemies.

But what neither the state or science can provide is that inner security which every human being needs. We can so easily become subject to our emotions and passions and arouse a civil war within us. Like the fig tree in the parable of today's Gospel, we can become fruitless; be so taken up with ourselves that our spiritual life withers away. God would be perfectly just if he left us without the fertilising help of his grace.

We are in constant need of this grace of repentance; none of us is perfect and if we endeavour to be completely self-reliant disaster will follow.

Our inward peace and security must arise from the recognition of God's power and love as shown to us in Christ. Christ said: *Without me you can do nothing*. The branches of the tree must be embedded in him. If we, the branches, are cut off from him, they cannot bear fruit and are only fit to be burnt. It is obviously prudent to take measures for material security, but a guarantee against economic or other material loss is no guarantee of inner security or peace. It alone cannot give us that peace of which Christ spoke, and indeed it can so entice us as to do exactly the opposite. We have the consolation of knowing from Christ's words in today's parable that if we do go wrong, he will offer us the grace of repentance.

THE SEASON OF LENT: Lent is a penitential season of prayer, self-denial and helping others (almsgiving). In this way, the whole Church prepares for Easter with those who are to be baptised. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence. The law of fasting binds those who have completed their *eighteenth* year, until the beginning of their *sixtieth* year. The law of abstinence binds those who have completed their *fourteenth* year. The rationale behind the Church's law is an invitation for us to join ourselves to Jesus in his forty days of self-denial in the desert. As we imitate our Saviour, we confront our own human weakness and remind ourselves of the brevity of life and our need for salvation which only comes through faith and imitation of Christ.

The Pascal precept binds all Catholics to receive Holy Communion at least once a year between Ash Wednesday and Trinity Sunday. The faithful are also obliged to confess their grave (mortal) sins individually in the Sacrament of Penance at least once a year.

The practice of almsgiving during Lent is recommended by contribution to Project Compassion. Project Compassion Boxes and Envelopes are available this Sunday in the foyer of the Church.

Stations of the Cross: This beautiful devotion apt for the season of Lent will be conducted in the Church each Friday during Lent at 7 pm. Come and walk the journey in memory of Christ crucified.

This weekend the St. Vincent de Paul Conference will be taking up a leaving collection after the weekend Masses for the relief fund for flood affected areas in the State.
