
WELCOME BACK

THE POWER OF FAITH: Our Lord is telling us in today's Gospel that faith is an explosive power. He uses the image of an uprooted tree to express it. Its violence transforms a person, uproots from the soil of complacency and egoism and imparts new powers and insight. Now a person can rise from the grave in a resurrection of glory; now life takes on a new significance, now we can live by principles which are the flowering forth from the rich soil of the grace and love of Christ. This living powerful faith enables us to view the world with new vision. We have *the evidence of things which do not appear*; bread is converted into "Bread from Heaven" and a vine is transformed into the being of Christ.



But although we have these new powers within us it does not cause us to run away from life. It does not confine us to an ivory tower in some far away castle. Faith has to do with ordinary living. It is not a starry-eyed affair. The person of faith remains very much down to earth, engaged amid the dust of everyday activities but with new strength and vision. Thus, life for us is no

longer meaningless: I am the Resurrection and the Life, says our Blessed Lord, he who believes in me though he be dead shall live. It is the Lord

who is the power within faith. He uproots what is dead and causes it to live in a new splendour of existence. Faith keeps a person *rooted and founded in Christ*. He gives the grace to believe; but there must be a response of acceptance from the human heart. Christ lays the trail, but we, in the end, must ignite the explosive force. Even Saul, who was knocked down on the Damascus road, by the violence of God's grace, was able to accept it because fundamentally he was a man of good will. The more we make ourselves ready to receive the grace of faith, the greater will be it explosive power in us.


Daylight Saving commences this Sunday: Please move your clocks and watches forward one hour before retiring this Saturday evening.
